



Commentary		
In June 2025 Golden Baggers transferred £1,768.33 into GLEE account as agreed at the 2025 AGM for GLEE to run events and the community café.		
Golden Baggers retained the Stitchers funds within the account.		
Stitchers made £161.11 in 2025, their closing balance within the Golden Baggers account this year is £486.54		
GLEE currently have no debit card so online purchases have been made from the Golden Baggers account.		
GLEE have obtained a grant and money spent will be transferred back into the Golden Baggers account.		
The current GLEE loss is £3,150.03 which will be transferred back to Golden Baggers in February 2026		

Closing balance £3,760.89

Allotment income £1,815.01

Allotment expenditure £757.42

Overall profit for year £1,057.59

Last year we agreed to transfer funds for the cafe and events to GLEE and £1,760 was transferred. Due to banking difficulties Golden Baggers have continued to fund and take the profit/loss from the GLEE events. Currently GLEE owe our account £3,150.03 which should be transferred shortly.

3. Membership report

Members update

Three Baggers gave up their boxes and we welcomed **three** new Baggers early in the growing season.

Friends

In 2025 we had **around thirteen** Friends on the list.

Only **seven** Friends paid the subscription.

Waiting list

Three residents joined our waiting list during 2025 meaning there are now **five** people waiting for a box.

The longest wait time is currently since November 2024.

Membership subscriptions 2025

Subscriptions were received from all Bagers and 7 Friends. Subscription income totalled £1040.

Membership subscriptions 2026

Proposed subscriptions for 2026:

- Bagers £25 (no increase from 2024)
- Friends £10 (role of a Friend)

Assuming full occupancy (highly likely) and the same number of Friends (7 in 2025), this would give us £1120 income.

GOLDEN BAGGERS CONSTITUTION

Name The group's name is Golden Baggers (formally Edible Golden Lane)

The purposes of the group are: -

To create the opportunity for the growing of fruit and vegetables for the residents of Golden Lane Estate.
To provide a designated, well-managed and safe site on the Estate for the purpose of communal food growing
To encourage collaboration so that members learn from one another to extend their expertise in growing food.
To promote the benefits of the project Estate wide, through open days and an active programme of events.
to the sense of well-being and quality of life for residents of the Golden Lane Estate.

Carrying out the purposes

In order to carry out the purposes, the Committee has the power to: -

1. Raise funds, receive grants and donations
2. Buy materials, equipment and services for purposes of growing food
3. Co-operate with and support other groups with similar purposes
4. Managing the day-to-day function of the allotments

Membership

The Committee may admit to membership any resident of Golden Lane Estate who supports the purposes of the group. People who wish to become a member should apply to the Committee and should pay the annual subscription at the appropriate rate or rates as shall be determined by the Committee, payable on a predetermined date to be agreed at the AGM. (Membership lasts for 1 year and may be renewed). The Committee will keep an up to date membership list. Members shall agree to abide by the **Health and Safety policy, the Terms and Conditions and the Code of Conduct**. A waiting list for membership will be maintained with membership granted in line with application date.

Annual General Meeting – AGM

1. The AGM must be held every year, with 14 days notice given to all members telling them what is on the agenda.
2. A quorum of members must be present at the AGM.
3. A quorum is 8 members (out of 42)
4. The Committee shall present the annual report and accounts.
5. Any member may put themselves forward for election as Committee members at the AGM.
6. Every member has one vote.
7. Members shall elect between 3 and 10 members to the Committee. They will retire at the next AGM and may stand for re-election.

Committee

1. The Committee shall hold at least 3 meetings each year. They will elect a Chair, Treasurer and Secretary at their first meeting.

Communal tasks that need ownership

Social Sundays - 1st Sunday of every month in the growing season

Annual trip - Collect numbers, organize coach, location booking and logistics

Harvest event - Soup making, sparkler buying, H&S on the day, pumpkin carving

Shed - Tidy, make sure tools are cleaned & marked, monitor & replace lost tools

Maintenance - Waste, checking hose, locks, DIY jobs, signs, pruning

Herbs - Keep herb beds tidy and replace plants as necessary (budget available)

Fruits - Maintain soft fruit beds, prune and weed

Animals - Develop and implement measures to prevent crops being spoiled by squirrels etc

Biodiversity garden - Pond maintenance – plant management, bird feeders, bird bath

Kids area - Maintain and replace (budget available)
